SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Tonight, was the last night of the Fair and our third day of our work week. The Traffic Safety Unit received intel of a large side show coming to Turlock after 1600 hours. Due to this we had a short briefing allowing officers to handle calls for service and to be out in the field in case a sideshow occurred. At 1830 hours around 40 vehicles and over 100 spectators gathered creating a sideshow. Air 101 and officers were very quick to disrupt the side show causing it to disperse not long after it was formed. Officers also responded to a subject on a roof of a business trespassing. As officers arrived a drone was utilized which found the subject on the roof with burglary tools. The subject was booked into jail on multiple charges.
