SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Officers security checked an elderly female who was living in unclean conditions without water and little food. Her apartment had a very foul odor of animal feces and urine and the apartment manager was getting complaints about the smell. CRT responded for a mental health evaluation and determined she was not gravely disabled. APS was also notified of the situation. Officers also investigated a sex offense. The female victim reported she has

been dating a male who had herpes and she believes he intentionally spread the virus to her. An officer also made a traffic stop on a vehicle driving recklessly. The driver pulled over and ran from the vehicle. He eventually walked back to the car and was detained. He was determined to be under the influence of alcohol and had hit 2 parked cars along the way. He was 17 years old and arrested/cited to a parent.
