Officers were dispatched to check the area for a suspect vehicle involved in a hit & run. An officer located the suspect vehicle and attempted to make a traffic stop. The driver failed to stop and a pursuit as initiated. After a short pursuit the driver collided into a center median

at the intersection of Golden State and Monte Vista. The driver exited the vehicle and was immediately taken into custody. She was determined to be under the influence of alcohol, and this was her 4th DUI in 3 years. During the pursuit she side swiped another motorist who was trying to yield to the right for the officer's emergency lights. Nobody was injured during the incident and the 26-year-old female driver was arrested and booked on several charges, including DUI, Hit & Run, Pursuit, and Battery on an officer after she kicked an officer during the arrest.
