SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Our first day of the week started out busy. Additionally, it was the first day of the Stanislaus County Fair. Officers were kept busy throughout the day, handling calls for service and making several traffic enforcement stops. The call of note today included a subject who was involved in a collision and then fled the scene after colliding with a tree. Initially he had gotten stuck between the railroad crossing arms. SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Officers were dispatched to a violation of a restraining order in-progress. When they arrived they contacted the female victim outside her residence. She was in an argument with her boyfriend who has a valid court order protecting the female. The male was inside the residence and refused to come out initially. After some time of calling him outside, he complied and was arrested. Officers also responded to another domestic violence restraining order violation. The male suspect was wanted from a prior domestic violence investigation and had returned to the victim's residence. Officers arrived and located the suspect inside. He was arrested and booked into jail.
