## SPECIAL DEPLOYMENT EFFORTS:

- In March, 7 Downtown Overtime Extra Patrol shifts were worked. Officers are allowed to sign-up to work non-mandatable overtime shifts to provide extra patrols, specifically to downtown and city parks to address City Ordinance issues, illegal nuisance behaviors, and other criminal violations.
- Daily, the Traffic Safety Unit patrols school areas during morning and afternoon traffic for extra traffic enforcement to ensure the safety of students.
- Special Investigations Unit (SIU) served a search warrant in the 1000 block of Carousel Court related to a marijuana cultivation operation. Recovered 7 firearms including an assault weapon and a handgun with obliterated serial numbers. Also recovered were 300 marijuana plants. 1 adult arrest made.
- SIU participated in a human trafficking operation with the Sheriff's Office and Probation. 4 arrests were made during the operation related to prostitution and pimping.
- The Traffic Safety Unit (TSU) provided extra patrols around both high schools on March 14, 2018, for planned school walk outs. No issues occurred.
- TSU, volunteers (VIPS), and Explorers worked the Kettle Dash Run for traffic safety and road closure assistance. Approximately 300 runners participated.

## ANIMAL SERVICES & PET OF THE MONTH:

- During March, Animal Services Officers visited 123 residents for pet license enforcement.

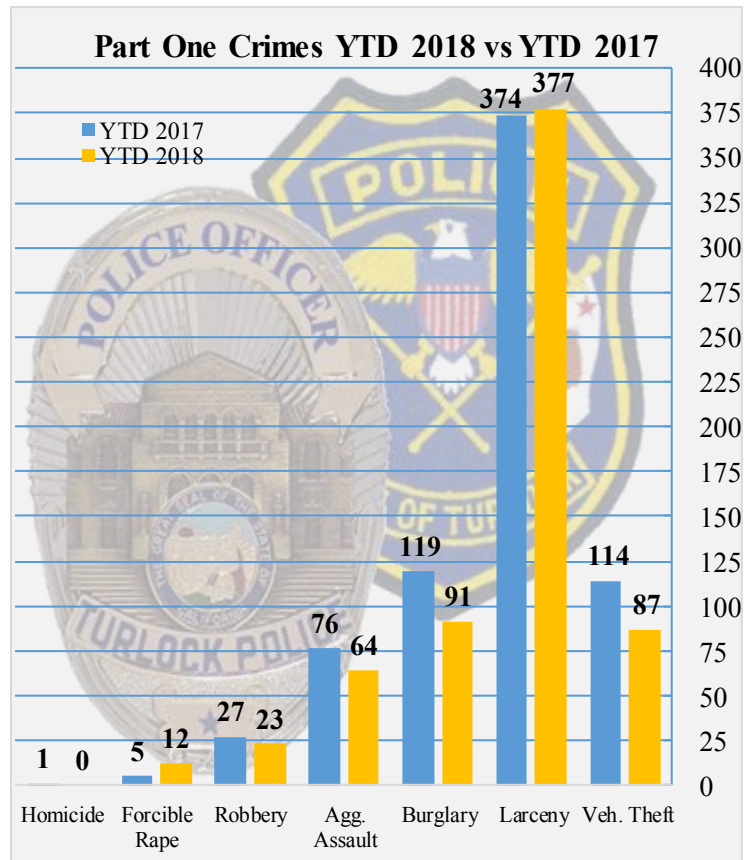

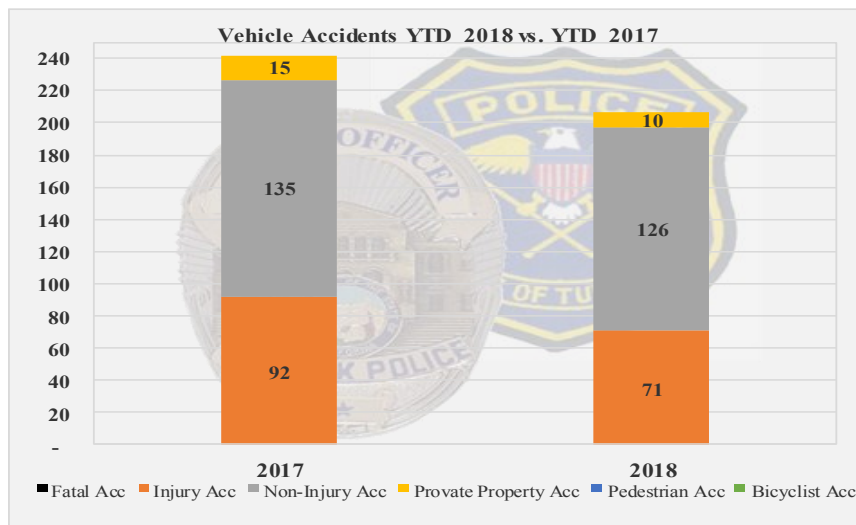
