SPECIAL DEPLOYMENT EFFORTS:

- 1. Coffee with the Chief, January 12, 2019—Chief Amirfar hosted a Coffee with the Chief event. This event is open to the community to come and address any questions or concerns they have about Turlock directly with the Chief of Police.
- Volunteers located and replaced 22 faded informational stickers on community mailboxes about how to report damaged/burglarized community mailboxes. In 2018, VIPS assisted the Post Office with the initial placement of these stickers to help with the increase of mail theft.
- 3. At the end of January, Special Investigations Unit (SIU) participated in a 2-day human trafficking statewide operation. Participating agencies included the Stanislaus Country Sheriff's Office, Probation and Parole. The first day, the operation was located in Wesley, which resulted in 10 arrests. The second day, the operation was located in Turlock, which resulted in 14 arrests.
- 4. On January 26, 2019, SIU hosted a Regional Apprehension Team Operation (RAT Op) with Probation and 2 additional detectives. The operation resulted with 7 arrests, 48 people contacted at 9 locations and 4 firearms recovered.
